EID employees currently pay absolutely nothing for their \$18,500 expanded health coverage yet nationally employees pay \$4,300... 27% of their total premium.

If EID employees paid their 27% national fair share average, EID rates would be \$1.1 million lower.

Why don't EID employees pay their 27% fair share of their upgraded \$18,500 medical coverage? This is \$5,000 per EID employee of extra compensation that should have been removed before EID's Board approved 102% of rate increases.

Why hasn't EID's General Manager and Board looked out for ratepayer financial interests instead of passing 102% of water rate increases for 2010-2015?
